Background

Now that you're getting familiar with ExhibitViewPC you probably understand you have options for actually presenting exhibits. You can save your project to a flash drive, Dropbox, etc and open it on a laptop. You now have the option to **SAVE-AS IPAD** and this is really exciting for our company & users. We are dedicated to making all our products work together better, save you time, money, and increase your presentation options!

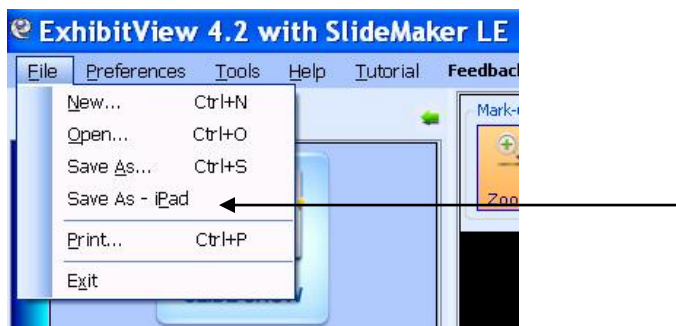
This feature, **SAVE-AS IPAD**, was designed to export your work/projects to be opened in ExhibitView Ipad™ however; it certainly will work the same for any other IPAD apps for presentation. *(Note: ExhibitViewPC is not required. ExhibitView Ipad can be used "stand alone" to create a project from scratch without the PC product. Obviously, we think using our PC brand makes great sense but you will be the judge)*

Saving As Ipad

Save as Ipad allows a user to export/send exhibits*, images, saved web content, witness folders, and slideshows created in ExhibitView PC, and then SAVE that project to a single folder, with all assets and subfolders inside, that you must copy/move into Dropbox and ultimately to ExhibitView Ipad. This feature will maintain your work product, HOT Document folders, witness folders, exhibits with or without markups and the project integrity. **SAVE-AS IPAD** feature allows you, our user, to choose another means by which you can orchestrate a presentation. *You're Laptop, Your Ipad, and Your choice! *Audio/Video will not be copied in this release, see end of this document for additional help with Video and Audio on the Ipad.*

How to Save to Ipad

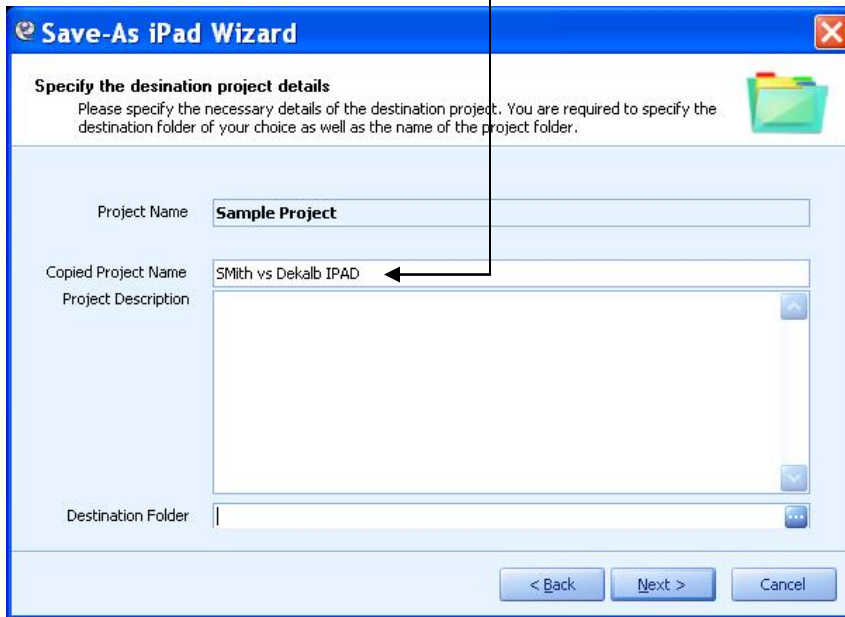
First, you must create a project in ExhibitView PC. When you ready to move from PC to Ipad you go to our File Menu and look for the Save as Ipad menu. See below.....





Where should I save my project & should I rename the project?

Good questions and the answers are important. If you wish to rename the project, you may, but please consider giving the project a suffix you can recognize. Such as **Smith v Dekalb IPAD**, the word in red is an example of a suffix you can use. See below...



Currently, the only way to bring this saved project into ExhibitView Ipad is via Dropbox. (Note: you can save the project anywhere and then move the project folder into Dropbox) See below





See below the final screen when your project is successfully saved for addition/importing to ExhibitView Ipad. Notice the final screen actually tells you once again where you actually saved your project.





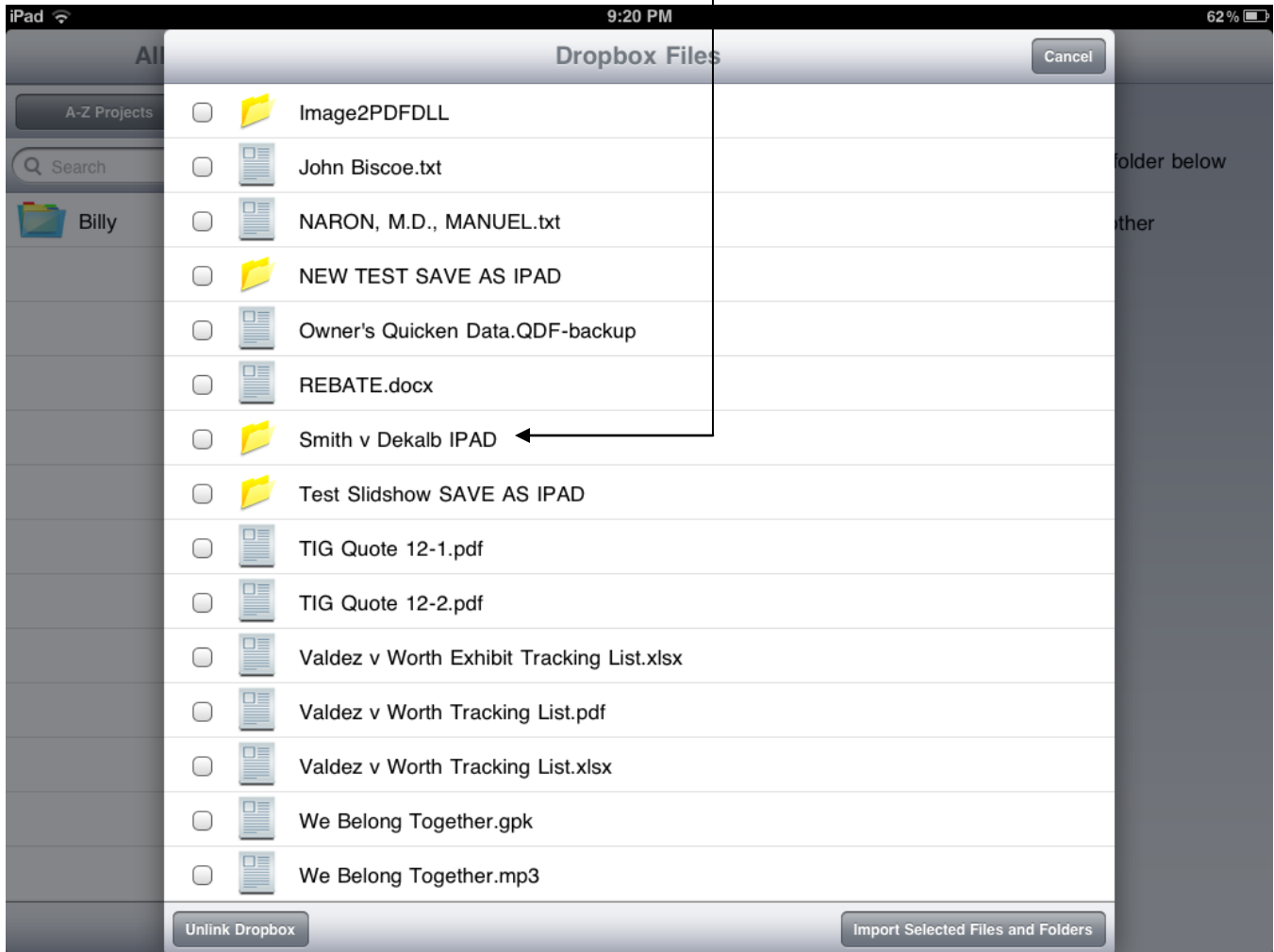
What is the next Step?

As you can see below, a screen from **ExhibitView Ipad™** This is where you will LINK your Dropbox account to our Ipad app and then everything in your Dropbox will be available to ADD to your Ipad app for presentation.





This next screen shows all your available assets and project folders you can ADD to ExhibitView Ipad. Just select the project folder and hit import! That's it!



File structure?

Files in ExhibitView PC are organized by file type, Slideshows and Witness folders. Witness folders allow merging various types of media. ExhibitView Ipad is a bit different. The data in the root exhibit library is mixed together however; parsing out just Documents, Images or Audio/Video is possible. Witness folders are brought into the ExhibitView Ipad as is and the contents are maintained. The only files NOT currently copied in the SAVE-AS IPAD function from PC are Audio/Video files. Why? Because Ipad requires all A/V media to be in either Mp4 or Mp3 and ExhibitView PC cannot currently auto convert into these formats. Look for that feature in an upcoming release.
